Meade Emory is a Professor of Law Emeritus at the University of Washington School of Law in Seattle. Mr. Emory has spent his entire professional career in the field of federal taxation--in government, private practice and law teaching. In government, he has served in several positions--as a trial attorney for the IRS District Counsel, Legislation Counsel for the Joint Committee on Taxation of the U. S. Congress and, also, as Assistant to the Commissioner of Internal Revenue. As a law teacher, Professor Emory has taught at many of this country's leading law schools (on many occasions as a distinguished visitor) including NYU, Duke, Pennsylvania, Tulane, Iowa Northwestern, Georgetown and UCLA. He serves on the board of editors of the Journal of Taxation, Tax Analysts (publisher of Tax Notes) and is the co-author of Bittker, Emory & Streng, Federal Income Taxation of Corporations & Shareholders--Forms, published by Warren, Gorham & Lamont. He is the author of dozens of tax articles and speaks regularly at national tax symposia. He is listed in current editions of Best Lawyers in America and Who's Who in America.
