

University of Florida Levin College of Law names Martin J. McMahon as Director of the Graduate Tax Program

The University of Florida Levin College of Law has announced that Martin J. McMahon, the James J. Freeland Eminent Scholar in Taxation has been appointed to succeed Michael K. Friel as Director of the Graduate Tax Program. Professor Friel stepped down as Director of the Graduate Tax Program when he retired at the end of the 2016-2017 academic year after serving as the Director for more than 25 years. Emeritus Professor Friel will continue to teach in the Graduate Tax Program as an adjunct professor, as have Lawrence Lokken, Emeritus Hugh Culverhouse Eminent Scholar in Taxation and Emeritus Professors David Hudson and Patricia Dilly. Professor McMahon has been a member of the faculty of the UF Graduate Tax Program since 1997. In his capacity as Director of the Graduate Tax Program, Professor McMahon will be working with the University of Florida Levin College of Law Appointments Committee in its search to hire three additional full-time tax faculty members to begin in Fall Semester of 2017. The exact search parameters will be forthcoming. At least one position will be an Eminent Scholar in Taxation chair and one will be a Professor of Practice position.
