<p>a TIGER WOODS LEARNING CENTER OVERVIEW The Tiger Woods Learning Center is a 35,000 sq ft 14-acre education facility located in Anaheim, CA. Inspired by the vision of Tiger Woods to provide a safe place for children to learn, the TWLC is at the nexus of two worlds: Positive Youth Development - The Learning Center's philosophy and approach to all aspects of the operation is grounded in the Search Institute's 40 developmental asset framework. High-quality Educational Enrichment - The Learning Center method is focused on assessing local community needs by involving educators, students and parents to create an interactive program that is meaningful and relevant to young people as they navigate the 21st century learning and work environment. TWLC Day Program - Career Orientation Program The TWLC Career Orientation Program (COP) provides local fifth grade students and their teacher with an interactive, authentic learning experience. Crime Lab 101 is a series of lessons that teach students about forensic science as a career, and provide them with a variety of hands-on activities including fingerprinting, DNA analysis, microscope use, and chromatography. Marine Science gives students an opportunity to explore ocean life and includes exploration of oceanic regions, squid dissection, analysis of sand samples, and marine life classification. While students participate in this hands-on science and technology workshop their classroom teacher receives professional development focused on providing them the knowledge and skills to recreate the TWLC experience in their classroom. Professional Development includes ways to incorporate positive youth development, science and the use of technology in the regular classroom environment. TWLC Afterschool Program - Career Exploration Program After school, the TWLC helps middle and high school students recognize their potential and identify their interests through a hands-on, authentic learning experience in the Career Exploration Program (CEP). Students utilize technology to complete homework, conduct research, and are given the opportunity to connect to a mentor or staff member in a self-selected career field of interest. Each seven-week session, student members may also choose to learn about a career by selecting from among 50 different career options. Thematic classrooms include Communications, Engineering, Business Entrepreneurship, Nutrition and Fitness, Universal Science, and Robotics. The curriculum gives students multiple opportunities to learn about careers by utilizing the computer and completing a hands-on project. For example, students enrolled in veterinary science will conduct dissections, analyze x-rays and have the opportunity to visit a nearby pet hospital and observe a pet examination. CEP staff also provides opportunities for students throughout Southern California to learn about the benefits of TWLC membership through a series of fieldtrips intended to support school-based programs that target underrepresented populations of students and encourage them to pursue a college education. During the fieldtrip students have the opportunity to explore careers, participate in an introductory college preparation workshop and participate in a select variety of hands-on experiments with a science, math or technology emphasis. The objective of the fieldtrip is to provide participants with the knowledge of an additional resource that supports them with their future plans while giving them the understanding of what they need to do to become a TWLC member. TWLC Computer Clubhouse The Intel Computer Clubhouse program is open to all current and past TWLC member students and allows for free exploration of new and innovative technology and software focused on digital art, web design, video production, video game creation, music/sound production, and much more. A variety of clubs are also available for students including filmmaking and a newsletter club. TWLC Community Outreach Programs In addition to programming, various community outreach programs are offered by TWLC. These programs include town hall meetings, guest speakers, and college preparation meetings for student members. The audience for these programs includes local TWLC members and families as well as families and students from throughout Southern California. Programs are held in the TWLC auditorium and on school campuses, based on individual and site needs. TWLC Summer Programming TWLC provides a variety of programs to students throughout Southern California during the summer months. Programs include golf as a recreational activity, week long classes in film production, aerospace, health and fitness, robotics, and engineering, and much more. TWLC also enables students to participate in diverse activities around the country including the College Access Program at the University of Wisconsin, Madison, language immersion camps at Concordia Language Villages, and, Summer Seminar at the United States Air Force Academy. TWLC Golf COP/CEP Golf Academy - Students enrolled in a TWLC core program learn the basics of golf instruction. This includes origin of golf, safety rules, putting (the smallest swing) to the full swing (the longest swing) and basic character education/etiquette. Students are encouraged to continue their participation in the program through weekend clinics, camps, open practice sessions and by qualifying for the player development program. Golf Outreach Programs - Through funding by the United States Golf Association, we are able to take the TWLC Golf Program on the road. By visiting local elementary schools we are able to create awareness of the TWLC and expose the game of golf. The TWLC Coordinator of Golf Outreach visits 5th and 6th graders in Orange County with a 3 phase golf program emphasizing the fundamentals of putting, pitching and the full swing. Since December 2008, the TWLC Outreach effort has introduced the game of golf to over 3,000 5th and 6th graders in Orange County. Weekend Golf Clinic - Held each weekend, golf clinics are offered to provide beginning and advanced golf instruction to TWLC members and non-members. Typically held on Saturdays, we offer a morning session and an afternoon session that run for three hours each session. The clinics involve games, contests, snacks and prizes to provide a fun and innovative golf experience. Player Development Program - Through a tiered structural design, each golfer's skill and knowledge level of the game are assessed and recognized with a special TWLC Tour Card. Each level requires a comprehensive (written) test and skills (player's ability) test to advance through the program starting from Tour Class (beginner), through Player Class (intermediate) and graduating from Master's Class (advanced). Students who have earned Master's distinction are have demonstrated competency in all the facets of game, are able to conduct themselves with excellence on and off the course with the character associated with the game of golf. Formal assessment dates will be offered each month through CEP Golf Academy and Weekend Golf Clinics. Golf Access Program- Students in the Player Development Program's Level 2 are qualified to participate in golf course outings to local golf courses in Orange County. Students sign up and play based on golf course availability and course readiness. Some of the golf courses are executive, high end golf courses that normally would be inaccessible to students of Orange County due to transportation or high priced green fees. Some of the courses available to TWLC students are H G Dad Miller, Tustin Ranch Golf Club, Black Golf Club, Coyote Hills Golf Course, Aliso Creek Golf Course, and many more.
